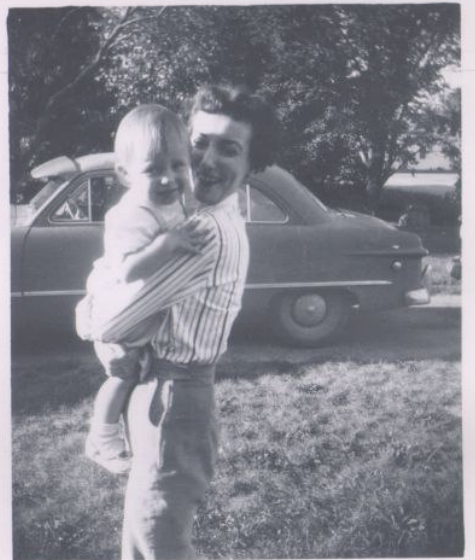

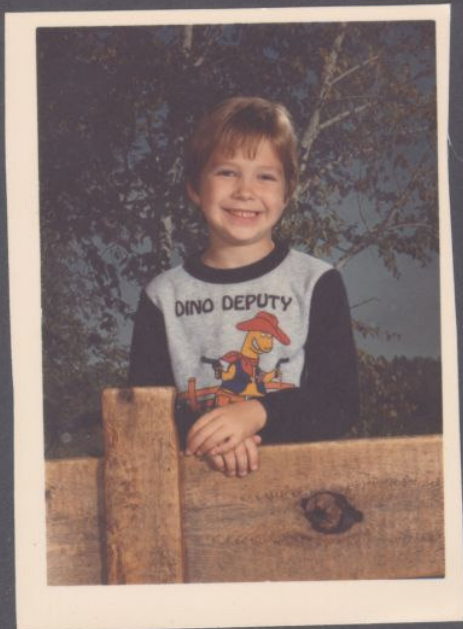
















**MR. AND MRS. ROBERT STRASBAUGH**

# Special Honors For Martha

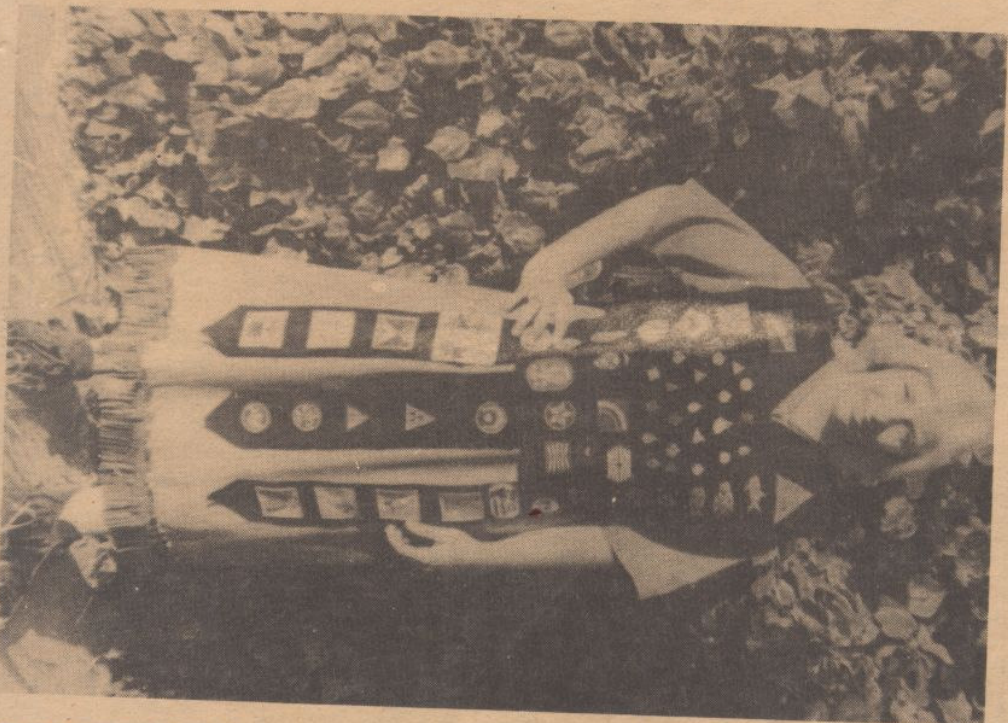
## Wohelo Medalion Winner

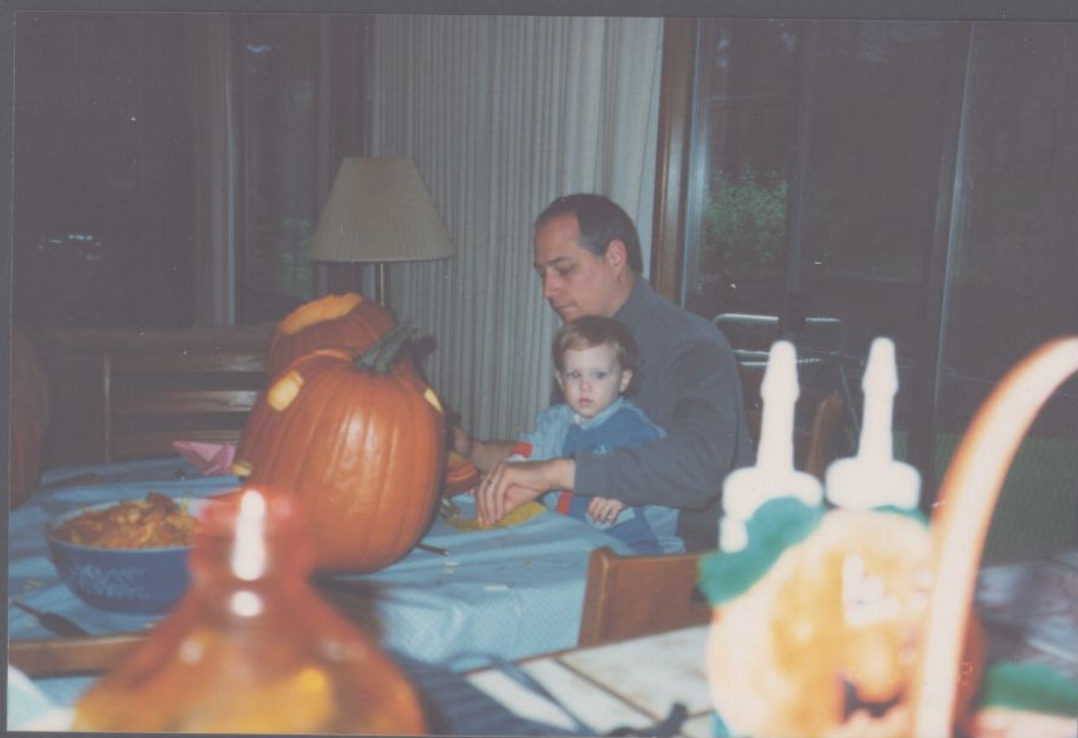

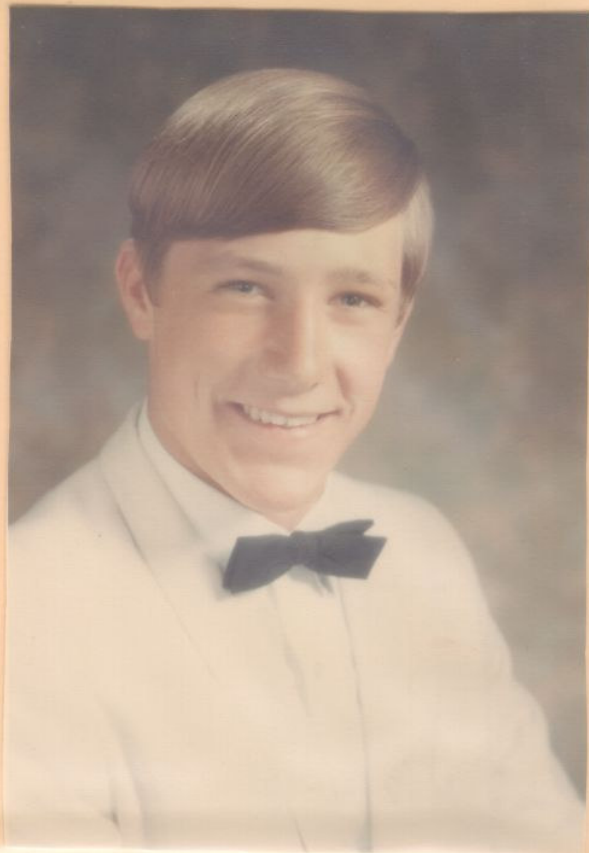

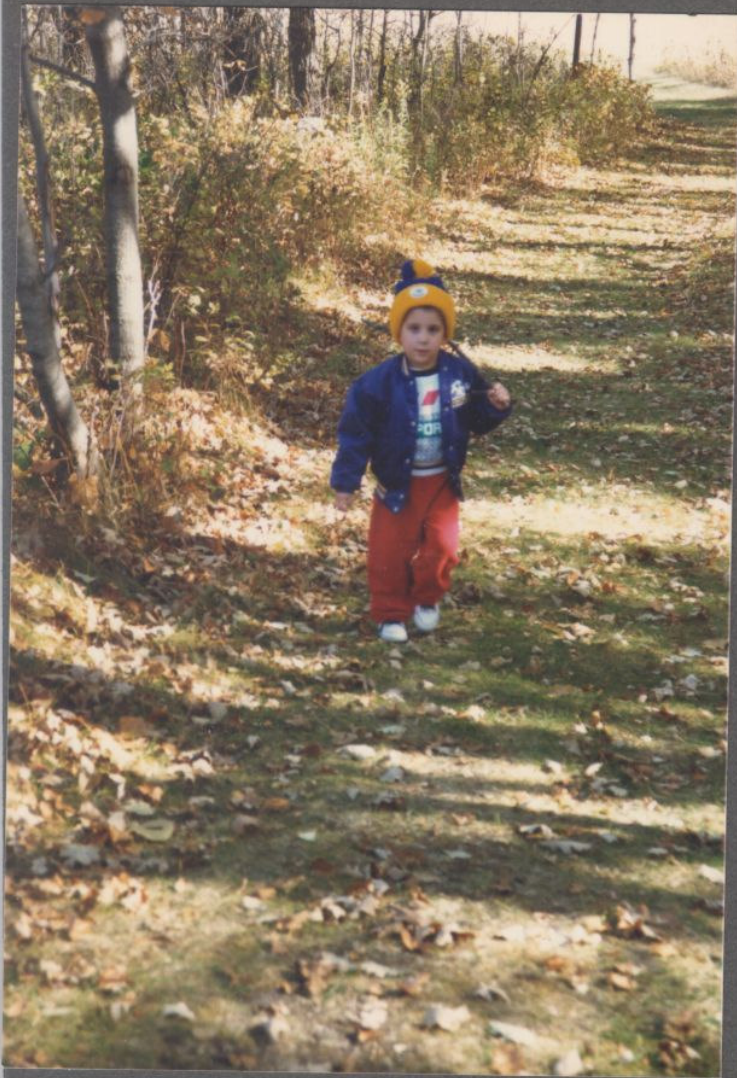

### Mrs. Berwin (Gwen) Purrier

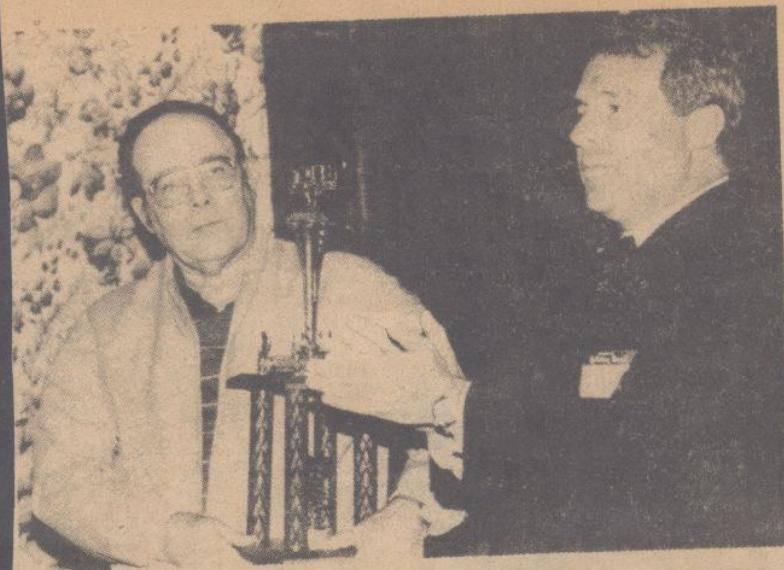

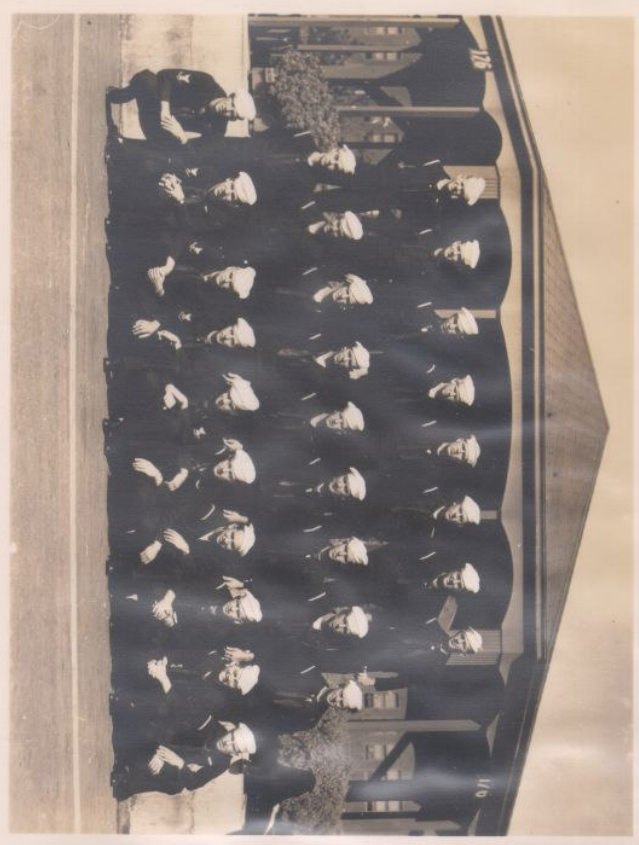
